Jewish Life in Arab Countries

Saul Silas Fathi

Tuesday October 18 at 7:30 pm

Please join us for refreshments in the Sukkah and to welcome back Saul Silas Fathi for a compelling lecture about *Jewish Life in Arab Countries*. Hear Saul Silas Fathi's personal story, chronicled in his book *Full Circle: Escape from Baghdad and the Return* as he describes his firsthand account of the 1941 Kristallnacht (Farhood) in Baghdad and his harrowing escape.

Mr. Fathi will share the journey of his prominent Iraqi Jewish family and their escape from persecution. From the newly-formed State of Israel, to Brazil and finally to the United States, Mr. Fathi then joined the U.S. Army and served in Korea and returned to a fascinating career in three Fortune-500 companies. Following September 11, 2001, Mr. Fathi volunteered to work for the FBI. Saul Silas Fathi's fascinating story is an inspiration to us all.

Commemoration of Kristallnacht Friday, November 11

at Shabbat Service at 6:30 pm

Holocaust survivor Hanne Liebmann will share her story at our Kristallnacht Commemoration. She will recount her experiences growing up in Germany, as the Nazis forced her, along with her elderly grandmother and aunts from their home. They were arrested and placed on a deportation train to the Gurs concentration camp in France. Ms. Liebmann was later placed in a children's home, run by the Swiss Red Cross Children's Aid Association in Le Chambon France.

She saw two extremes of human behavior during the war: cruelty at the hands of the Nazis and kindness at the hands of the French Huguenots of Le Chambon where the local pastor had told his village to "defy the devil" and protect the Jews. When the Nazis came and demanded the Jews, the pastor said "We do not know what a Jew is; we only know a man."

Military Ethics and the Israel Defense Forces

One of the drafters of the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) ethics code, Moshe Halbertal will address the issue of the morality of war. How do soldiers follow military directives and honor their personal ethics at the same time? How does a Democratic nation such as Israel, justify its own defense and protect its citizens and soldiers?

A fellow at the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem, Dr. Halbertal is the Gruss Professor at NYU Law School and a Professor of Jewish Thought and Philosophy at Hebrew University where he earned his PhD. He has been a visiting professor both at Harvard and University of Pennsylvania law schools.

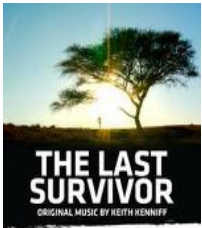
Dr. Hussein Rashid

Engaging hundreds of members, Temple Israel joined other congregations and organizations in successful campaigns for health care access, affordable housing, public education, gay and lesbian rights, nursing care workers rights, and living wage. He was the Meyer W. Nathans Scholar at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion where he was ordained in 1997.
