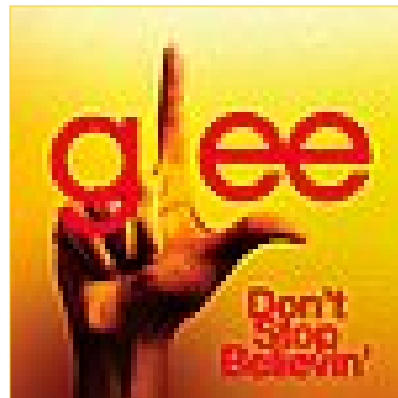

“Not Your Grandfather’s Seder” Features Food For Thought And Food For Seder Sunday, March 18 at 9:30 am



To prepare for the annual holiday of matzah and Manischewitz, of charoset and chicken, **please hold the date of Sunday, March 18** for “**Not Your Grandfather’s Seder,**” a unique morning of learning and joyful celebration of Jewish heritage with renowned scholar and modern Haggadah author **Noam Zion** of the Shalom Hartman Institute in Israel.

Temple Sinai’s pre-Passover event, sponsored by the Adult Education Committee, will feature a fascinating presentation by **Noam Zion**, entitled “**101 Ideas for a More Participatory Seder.**”

While Noam Zion will provide members with much food for thought, Temple Sinai’s own **Rhonda and Joel Wolf** plan to inspire palates and appetites with a **Passover cooking demonstration**, featuring their own time-tested and delectable recipes.

The Wolfs’ food presentation will take place directly after Mr. Zion’s Seder discussion. He is well-known for his up-to-date Haggadahs that families around the world are utilizing to create their own unique Passover experiences, depending on participants’ ages and interest levels. He has written *A Different Night*, both in classic and compact versions; and *A Night to Remember*. Both Haggadahs are accessible on the website www.haggadahsrus.com

The just-mentioned website notes of Zion’s *A Night to Remember*, “This is the original – the Haggadah that slew the Maxwell House.” While adult congregants are learning with Zion, children will take part in a special program the Temple’s religious school is planning. See below.

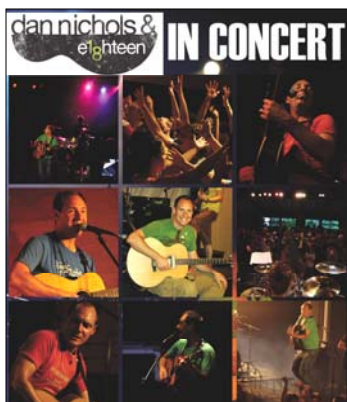
A Very Special Passover Workshop for Students Sunday, March 18 at 9:30 am

Join Us as We Welcome Jewish Rock Star Dan Nichols Friday, March 16 at 7:30 pm

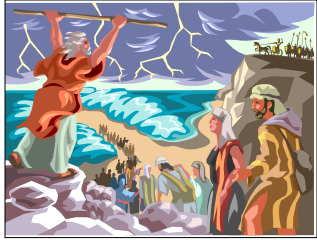
